Hopefully the next few years become more settled, and we can move confidently toward future planning and development of Member Welfare and Social facilities.

I appreciate the support and ongoing generosity of your elected Committee of Management, the Appeals Sub-Committee chaired by Mary Bell, the Welfare Sub-Committee chaired by John Merrett, the Commemorations Sub-Committee chaired by Terry Power, the Poppy Ladies, Volunteer members and Volunteer staff members.

During COVID we kept in contact with our veterans by phone and assisted them by delivering hampers of essential necessities.

Special thanks to those volunteers who shake the tins selling badges and poppies at the local shopping centres and the ANZAC Day Eve MCG AFL match. The funds raised by Trish Beecroft, Dot Thomas and their loyal helpers on Friday evenings are also a most valuable contribution to our Veteran Welfare Funds.

I thank the retiring Committee members for their valued service to our Sub-Branch over many years — Peter Egan, Mark Stewart and Les Luscombe. Mark will continue to assist with conducting RSL Funeral Services, Anzac Day Services at local football games and representing our Sub-Branch at various other RSL Commemorative Services at other venues. Les will also continue to assist with accounting and financial matters as we transition toward outsourcing.

Thanks to the Commemoration Sub-Committee for their flexibility and perseverance with the work preparing for the ANZAC Day Dawn Service and Remembrance Day Service which were well attended and conducted under extremely severe Government Regulations and limitations. A 'thank you' also to staff for their work organising compliance with Vic Health Covid Requirements and a special thank you to all the volunteers who donated their time on the days of those events. Every one of you contributed to the success of our Commemorative services.

Thanks to Peter Egan and Leisa Webb for organising the Service Members and Widows Luncheon. It was a successful event and we received positive feedback. Plans for another luncheon or dinner are in progress.

Congratulations to the six new Club Life Members who received their awards at the luncheon, Trish Beecroft, Peter Egan, Faye Sanders, John Sanders, Mark Stewart and Colin Whitworth.

Congratulations to Terry Power on being awarded the RSL National Certificate of Merit with Gold Badge, the highest award which can be presented to an Affiliate Member. The award will be presented to Terry by RSL Victoria State President, Dr Robert Webster OAM.

Volunteer hours for 2021 totalled 33,204, which is a great result, but less than previous years obviously due to COVID restrictions and subsequent cancellation of many events. Our volunteers are truly inspiring with the way they support our veterans in numerous ways. However, I do encourage all volunteers to submit their hours at all times in order for our Sub Branch to share with others the amazing work we achieve whilst enjoying the friendship of our mates. Please enquire with our Office Admin Staff if assistance is required in recording volunteer hours.

After the many government lockdowns ceased, the Sub Branch was finally able to make our new "Nance Ormsby Community Room" available for community use. The Community Room has been utilized by community groups such as Epping Pensioners, Whittlesea Motorcycle Club, Custom Car Club, Business Groups, as well as locally sponsored sporting clubs such as Epping Football Netball Club, Epping Cricket Club, Rivergum Cricket Club, and Emergency services being Epping CFA and Epping Police. Several funerals and wakes have been held as well as family celebrations, birthdays and anniversaries.

Thank you to Narelle and all our staff for ongoing, efficient, and friendly service to our members and guests.

I express my condolences to the families of deceased members and apologies to those who were unable to receive an RSL Funeral Service, due to periods of lockdown.

Finally, thank you to all members for your patronage and encouragement during a difficult period. The Sub-Branch is in a sound financial position and I encourage all members to continue supporting our most valued Veteran Welfare organisation.







Treasurer's Report:

Once again, the Club had to struggle through an interrupted COVID related year with the Club being compelled to close for a total of 130 days because of lock downs. However, we were able to meet all of our financial obligations throughout the year and still return an outstanding profit overall with the assistance of government subsidies, which totaled \$431,318.

Sub-Branch

Due to lockdowns trading comparisons with previous years have been difficult, however with the assistance of Jobkeeper in the first three months of 2021 and government subsidies later during lockdowns, the Sub-branch was able to record a net profit of \$175,577 for the year (last year was a loss of \$442,112).

Jobkeeper and govt subsidies totaled \$431,318 whilst rent of \$561,237 was paid to the Patriotic Fund to cover loan repayments and interest costs. Welfare and charitable expenses totaled \$85,579 for 2021, an increase from \$39,147 in 2020.

An upgrade to the Gaming room air conditioning was completed during the year to compliment the upgrade in 2020 of the air conditioning units throughout the Bistro area.

The Sub-branch ended the year with a General Account Bank Balance of \$873,740 and an Accumulated Fund bank balance of \$569,013. The Accumulation Fund will be used to purchase our Electronic Gaming Machine floor stock when the current leasing arrangement with MPS ends in August 2022.

Sub-Branch Patriotic Fund

After receiving 12 month's rent payments totaling \$561,235 from the Sub-branch Inc, the Patriotic Fund ended the year with a surplus of \$261,353 for 2021. With this result the Patriotic Fund was able to repay \$165,000 of its related party loan to the Sub-branch.

The Fund provided welfare activities totaling \$11,737, a slight increase from \$10,713 in 2020. Once again this was due to lockdowns curtailing many activities during the year.

Finance costs increased from \$58,448 in 2020 to a total of \$93,513 in 2021 as a result of our first full year after the completion of our community rooms, with our bank debt level decreasing to \$1,831,614 as at the completion of the year.

The Sub-Branch Patriotic Fund bank account ended the year with a balance of \$72,108.

General Appeals Account

The General Appeals Patriotic Fund received income of \$43499 from Appeals during 2021 with only \$3087 received for Remembrance Day poppies due to being in lockdown at that time.

The auditors, Grant Thornton, have completed the audit of the 2021 Accounts and have also completed financial reports for the 3 entities of the Epping RSL Sub-Branch Inc.

Commemoration Services Report

March Day 2021:

Unfortunately, due to COVID-19 restrictions no Memorial March was held this year. Hopefully it will be back again next year, bigger and better.

ANZAC Day Dawn Service 2021:

Due to COVID-19 and crowd restrictions we estimated that a crowd of about 1000-1500 attended the service which was more than we had hoped.

Invited guests who attended included: Member for Mill Park Mrs. Lily D'Ambrosio, Member for Thomastown Mrs. Bronwyn Halfpenny, Member for Northern Metropolitan Region Mr. Craig Ondarchie, Member for Scullin Mr. Andrew Giles and Mr. Jim Papadimitriou who on behalf of the Greek community laid a wreath to commemorate the 80th Anniversary of the Battle of Crete.

Our prelude this year was centered around the Vietnam War and the battle of Long Tan. Our thanks again go out to Tanya and Frank for all the hard work and time in putting these stories together.

A special thank you to the management and staff, all the volunteers, as well as the ANZAC Day Committee who helped with all the QR code and vaccination checks and manning entrances to the Cenotaph. The service went well and our thanks to all involved.

We welcomed the Reverend Carole Lloyd Flanders, who recited the Lord's Prayer. Once again our thanks go out to the Army Cadets from Watsonia 39th ACU who give us great support every year.

Another special thanks to Epping CFA, Whittlesea SES and the First Aid Medics for their attendance.

Unfortunately, we could not hold our gunfire breakfast due to COVID-19 restrictions but we hope that we will be back to normal in 2022.





Remembrance Day 2021:

The Epping RSL has had an Angling Club for 39 years. One of the founding members still has an active role in the club, although at a reduced capacity. With the club's 40th year approaching we are looking for new members and hopefully have some old members to return and join us.



2021 proved to be the second challenging year in a row.

Due to COVID-19 the number of meetings held by the Angling Club were restricted to March, April, May, July, November and December.

Due to COVID-19 restrictions, meetings were moved to Tuesday afternoons and then later in the year to Tuesday evenings. Meetings have continued to be held on Tuesdays.

Club competitions were reduced to only 5 in 2021. Due to the number of competitions and lack of fish being caught for the year the club decided to forgo competition trophies and no club champions were awarded. 2022 has started off as a very good year for fishing. With the relaxation of COVID-19 restrictions all competitions have been attended. Our first charter, in Westernport Bay, all members caught a good variety of fish on the day. More on that next year!

All Epping RSL members are welcome to join regardless of type of membership. All Angling Club current members are willing and wanting to share their experiences, expertise and stories with any new member. The Epping RSL Angling Club supports the opportunity to learn and share while enjoying a healthy outdoor sport. Membership is open to all Epping RSL members. Cost is \$10 annually or \$5 for pensioners. We would love to have you join our club.



Bowls Report:

As the bowls pennant season is played in summer and overlaps into the next calendar year, this bowls club contribution to the Annual Report is not solely 2021 related.

In May 2021 our club participated in the annual RSL Victoria lawn bowls competition, the Duke of Edinburgh Shield, and went to Corowa with 5 other teams. It is a very social event attended by many RSLs from all over Victoria and encourages great camaraderie among both the Service and Affiliate members that play. There were about 16 venues around Victoria all playing on the same weekend and we did very well and won the competition for the Corowa venue, with Lakes Entrance being runner-up. We were fortunate to get it played because within a few days of returning to Melbourne, the state was again closed due to an increase in COVID cases.

For the second successive year, COVID prevented our usual winter bowls social competition being played and caused delays to the commencement of the pennant season. We didn't begin until mid-November with a reduced number of games. From there though, it was all good news.

We have approximately 50 members, playing in three weekend teams (Divisions 3, 5 and 7) and two midweek teams (divisions 3 and 4).

The weekend Division 3 team, despite only finishing third, went on to win our section and then eventually won the Metropolitan wide championship. We defeated Glenroy in the quarter final, Murrumbeena Park in the semifinal and Yarraville Footscray in the grand final, which will now see us being promoted to Division 2 next year. Our second team has previously won the grand final (twice) as has one of our midweek teams, but this is the first time our first team has done so. Fantastic results for a club which is only 20 years old.

The second weekend team struggled for consistency and didn't win enough games to make finals. The third weekend team did really well in making the finals but didn't make it past the first game. With player shortages in higher teams due to COVID outages and injuries, the third team often played short but still won enough games to make finals.

In midweek competition, the first team did well to make the section final but was unable to defeat the team which had beaten them during the season. A promotion to Division 2 is likely for next year. The second team struggled this year and is in danger of being relegated next season. One positive is that we had sufficient players to field 2 teams all season. Every player was invested in the team and keen to play, which bodes well for next season.

Since last season the club is proud to say it has contributed 50% of the cost towards the completion of two major projects to the bowling green area. The Ken Williams (western) green had new synthetic grass surrounds laid and the old floodlights were replaced with upgraded LED systems. The Herb Mason (eastern) green had the surrounds and lights done two years ago, also on a 50/50 basis with the RSL. The bowls club has also purchased 3 new aluminum table and seat sets which are installed around the greens.

If anyone is interested in playing, we would be pleased to welcome them. We're always keen for new members and have purchased spare sets of bowls for use of people while learning the game. The sets can also be loaned to playing members on bowls days by arrangement.

The previously mentioned winter social bowls is running again this year and is open to everyone who would like to play. Simply be at the RSL by 12.15 on a Saturday to register. We can also run barefoot bowls by request. Enquiries can be made at the front office.





Darts:

The Darts Club was officially formed when Bob Holmes became president of the Epping RSL in 1987. Prior to this there were two teams who played for fun, one was playing metro and one playing regional. At the time Bob Holmes asked darts player Leon Bourke to join the two teams together and so began the proper formation of the Epping RSL Darts Sub Club.

We are only a small club of approximately 40 members. We have three Wednesday night teams (A grade, B grade, C grade) and one 1 Friday night team.

We do not charge an annual subscription; the only cost is a weekly playing fee of \$5 – applicable on game days.
